Chapter 47.

An act in addition to "an act establishing town courts," approved March twentysecond, eighteen hundred and forty-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The jurisdiction of justices of the peace in and Jurisdiction of for the county of Waldo, in the trial of all civil causes, is pence in civil causes in civil causes restored. hereby restored in as full and ample a manner as it was before the passage of the act to which this is additional.

SECT. 2. The fifth section of an act entitled "an act in Sec. 5, of Act Aug. 10, 1846, addition to an act establishing town courts," approved August <sup>repealed.</sup> tenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, limiting the right to appeal from the decision of the justices of the said town court, be and the same is hereby repealed.

The thirtieth section of the act to which this is Inconsistent acts Sect. 3. additional and all other acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 48.

An act respecting school agents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

**Sect.** 1. School agents, whether elected by towns or by How sworn. their respective districts, shall be duly sworn by the clerk of the district, by the town clerk, or by some justice of the peace.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
