CHAP. 68. a part of which is spirituous or intoxicating, in violation of the provisions of this act, he shall forfeit and pay for each offense, not less than one nor more than twenty dollars."

> Sect. 3. The provisions of the act to which this is additional shall be applicable to this act.

Chapter 68.

An act additional to the sixth chapter of the revised statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Representatives to the legislature elected by plurality.

Sect. 1. The twenty-seventh section of the sixth chapter of the revised statutes, is so far altered and amended, that any person shall be deemed or declared elected a member of the house of representatives, who shall have received at any election for representatives the highest number instead of a majority of all the ballots.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 69.

An act to increase the salary of the judge of probate for the county of Waldo.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary \$200.

The judge of probate in the county of Waldo shall be entitled to receive a salary in quarterly payments on the first day of January, April, July and October, of each year, of two hundred dollars per annum instead of the sum now allowed.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.
