PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE,

1848.

CHAP. 105. each, and said bank shall be located and established in Hallowell in the county of Kennebec.

Powers, privileges and liabilities.

SECT. 3. Said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state and subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

Chapter 105.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Appropriation of money for certain purposes.

In order to provide for the operation of certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury; the same to be in lieu of all existing appropriations whatever. And the governor with the advice and consent of the council is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of May next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.

Governor may draw his warrant prior to May 1, 1849.

Chapter 106.

An act to authorize the Androscoggin and Kennebec Rail Road Company to
increase its capital stock.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Increase, \$400,-
000.

SECT. 1. The Androscoggin and Kennebec Rail Road
Company is hereby authorized to increase its capital stock, by
adding thereto, the sum of four hundred thousand dollars, to
be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 107.

An act to change the name of the "Salt Water Falls Company," and to extend
the time of completing its works.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. The Salt Water Falls Company is hereby allowed
