SECT. 12. Any two persons named in this act, may call the First meeting. first meeting of said company at any time after the passage of the act, for the choice of officers and the transaction of any other business relating to the interest of the company, by publishing a notice of the time and place of said meeting in one or more of the newspapers printed in Bath, which notice shall be at least ten days prior to said meeting; and this act shall when to take efnot take effect unless property to the amount of thirty thousand dollars at least, shall be agreed to be insured by said company. Said company may at its first meeting, or an adjournment thereof, choose any or all the officers named in the third section of this act, with full powers to manage the concerns of the company, till the annual meeting or till other officers shall be chosen in their stead.

Chapter 117.

An act to authorize the laying out a road over tide waters in the town of Bowdoinham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The county commissioners of the county of Lincoln, or the Location. selectmen of the town of Bowdoinham, are hereby authorized if they deem it expedient to lay out and establish a public highway in said town of Bowdoinham, easterly from land of Job Jellerson, in said Bowdoinham, across Abagadassette river to land of Preble, notwithstanding said road may pass over tide waters.
