Chapter 156.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of the Union Academy at Oldtown.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Samuel Pratt, Silas Stow, Solomon Moulton, Corporators. SECT. 1. Samuel H. Merrill, Lorenzo Leadbetter, Rufus D. Folsom, Ephraim B. Peirce, William H. Smith, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of the Union Academy at Oldtown, and Corporate name. by this name may sue and be sued; have a common seal; Powers. make such by-laws, not repugnant to the laws of this state, as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs; fill all vacancies occurring in their number; take and hold real Real and personand personal estate that they may now possess or may here- " estate. after receive, by donation or otherwise, the annual income of Income, how upwhich shall not exceed two thousand dollars, said income to be faithfully applied to promote the cause of education; and the Powers of trusttrustees aforesaid are intrusted with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

This act shall take effect from and after its ap-SECT. 2. proval by the governor.

The first meeting of the trustees shall be called First meeting. SECT. 3. by Ephraim B. Peirce, by giving each incorporator a written notice of the time and place of meeting, seven days at least prior thereto.

Chapter 157.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of Limington Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. John H. Garmon, Isaac Mitchell, George Small, Corporators. Robert Brackett, Joshua W. Frost, Gideon L. Moody, Sewall Thompson, Israel S. Hopkinson, Isaac Dyer, Edward Clark, Richard Meserve and Moses E. Sweat, their associates, successors and assigns are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of Limington Academy; and by this Corporate name. name may sue and be sued; make such by-laws as they may Powers. deem expedient for the management of their affairs; fill all

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Emery, their associates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of the Trustees of Standish Academy; and by this name may sue and be sued; have a common seal; make such bylaws, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state, as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs; fill all vacancies occurring in their number; take Renl and person- and hold any estate personal and real, which they may receive by donation or otherwise, the annual income of which shall not exceed two thousand dollars; said income to be faithfully applied to promote the cause of education; and the trustees aforesaid are intrusted with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.
