SECT. 6. The annual meeting shall be holden in the month Annual meeting.
 of August, and at that and all other meetings, it shall require
 seven persons at least to constitute a quorum for the transaction
 of business; and meetings may be directed at other times by
 the president or the corporation.

Chapter 179.

An act authorizing the assessment of a certain tax upon the town of Bridgton.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
 in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

The treasurer of state shall forthwith issue his warrant, Amount.
 directed to the assessors of the town of Bridgton, requiring
 them to assess the sum of sixty dollars upon the polls and
 estates of the inhabitants of that town, and upon the owners
 of real estate therein, according to the principles of the tax act,
 approved April fifth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
 hundred and forty-five, and requiring the money to be collected
 and paid into the treasury of state, on or before the first day of
 January next; said sum being assessed by reason of the increase
 of the valuation of said town of Bridgton by the annexation
 to said town of a portion of the towns of Fryeburg and
 Denmark.
