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**Chapter 80.**

**CHAP. 80.**

Resolve in favor of James Robinson.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to James Robinson of Bangor, six dollars per month for five years from the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine, in consequence of loss of health while in the service of the state, in the winter of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine.

Pension, \$6 per month, for five years.

**Chapter 81.**

Resolve in favor of Joseph Pomroy.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to Joseph Pomroy, the sum of one hundred and forty-four dollars, it being a pension of four dollars per month for the years eighteen hundred and forty-one, eighteen hundred and forty-two and eighteen hundred and forty-three, for a wound received September third, eighteen hundred and fourteen as a soldier in a company commanded by captain James Poller then in the service of the commonwealth of Massachusetts, against the invading foe at Hampden.

Pension, \$144.

**Chapter 82.**

Resolve in favor of the inhabitants of Lexington.

*Resolved*, That the land agent of this state is hereby authorized and directed to remit or discount to the inhabitants of Lexington all interest accumulated on a note now in his office against said inhabitants for two hundred and fifty-four dollars and forty cents dated September nineteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine; *provided*, said inhabitants shall pay or cause to be paid into the treasury of state before the first day of May next the sum now due on the original purchase, exclusive of the said interest.

Land agent authorized to discount interest on a certain note.

Proviso.
