And it is therefore further declared that the constitution is so far altered or amended as to read thus:

"The constitution of this state is amended in the fifth section of the first part of the fourth article, by striking out the words, 'a majority of all the', and inserting instead thereof, the words, 'the highest number of', and by striking out the words, 'a majority', where they again occur in the same section, and inserting instead thereof, the words, 'the highest number'; also in the first amendment to the constitution of this state, by striking out the words 'a majority of all the', and inserting instead thereof the words, 'the highest number of'"—and that said amendment has become part of the constitution of this state.

Representatives to the legislature elected by plurality.

Chapter 85.

Resolve in favor of J. T. K. Hayward, J. B. Foster, and William W. Thomas.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state is hereby authorized to receive of J. T. K. Hayward, J. B. Foster, and William W. Thomas the original amount of the taxes assessed on sixteen thousand acres of land in township number nine in the county of Aroostook north of Weston, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty-three by the commissioners for the county of Aroostook, *provided*, the same shall be paid within thirty days from the passage of this resolve; and upon payment thereof said taxes are hereby directed to be discharged.

Right to redeem certain land in Aroostook county.

Proviso.

Chapter 86.

Resolve in favor of Rufus Mansur and another.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he hereby is authorized to release the title of the state to the lands sold on two executions in favor of the state, one against Rufus Mansur and

Land agent authorized to release the title of the state to certain lands.

CHAP. 87.

Condition.

Releases to
whom made.

James A. Drew, and one against Rufus Mansur, upon the payment of one thousand dollars within one year from the passage of this resolve, by the said Mansur or any one or more of the claimants to any of said lands. The releases herein provided for to be made to the persons respectively or their assigns, to whom, in the opinion of the land agent, said parcels of real estate equitably belonged at the time of sale on said executions.

Chapter 87.

Resolve in favor of the town of Belmont.

For support of
state paupers at
Insane Hospital.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to the town of Belmont the sum of one hundred fifty-one dollars and forty-three cents for committing to and supporting Daniel Friel in the Insane hospital, a state pauper, from June twenty-second, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, to June twenty-two, eighteen hundred and forty-eight.

Chapter 88.

Resolve in favor of the town of Waterford.

Bank tax.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized to pay out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirty-three dollars and fourteen cents, to the treasurer of the town of Waterford in the county of Oxford, said sum being the amount which said town would have received the present year in the distribution of the school fund, but for an error in preparing the abstract, on which the distribution was made.
