Chapter 102.

Resolve additional for payment of accounts against the state.

For payment of additional roll No. 29.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury of state, not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively named in the additional roll of accounts numbered twenty-nine, the sums set against the name of such persons, cities, towns and plantations respectively, amounting in the whole to the sum of six thousand two hundred thirty-eight dollars and ninety-three cents in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer.
