Chapter 106.

Resolve making provision for repairs of the Baring and Houlton road.

Appropriation therefor, \$200.

Resolved, That for the purpose of repairing the Baring and Houlton road through the half township number eleven in the county of Aroostook, there is hereby appropriated and allowed the sum of two hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the land agent.

[Approved August 10, 1848.]

Chapter 107.

Resolve in favor of Abner B. Thompson and the heirs of Roscoe G. Greene, deceased.

Land agent au-thorized to con-firm their title to certain land.

Proviso

Resolved, That the land agent of the state is hereby authorized and directed to confirm and establish to Abner B. Thompson and the heirs of Roscoe G. Greene, the title to lot number one hundred and twelve, one hundred and thirty-two, one hundred and thirty-four and one hundred and forty-seven, in township number one, Indian purchase; provided, the said heirs, by their guardian and Abner B. Thompson pay, or cause to be paid, into the treasury of the state fifty dollars on or before the first day of May next.
