1848.

CHAP. 117. wise appropriated, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council for the purpose of the foregoing resolve.

[Approved August 11, 1848.]

Chapter 117.

Resolve authorizing the treasurer of state to sell and dispose of United States stock.

Treasurer of state authorized to dispose of U. States stock.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state is authorized at any time prior to the first day of May next, to sell and dispose of, at not less than par, so much of the United States stock belonging to this state as the wants of the treasury may require, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars in amount.

Chapter 118.

Resolve for the pay roll of the house of representatives.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to the several persons named in the foregoing pay roll, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to thirty-one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven dollars.

Chapter 119.

Resolve in favor of Madawaska, Hancock and Van Buren plantations.

Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the several treasurers of Hancock, Van Buren and Madawaska plantations in the county of Aroostook, their several proportions of the bank tax of eighteen hundred and forty-seven and eight, said proportions to be apportioned upon the next returns of the scholars in said plantations made by the proper legal officers of the same.
