CHAP. 120.

Chapter 120.

Resolve in favor of William Sanborn.

Services as assistant messenger, 49 50.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of state, out of any money not otherwise appropriated to William Sanborn forty-nine dollars and fifty cents for his services as assistant messenger.
