Chapter 117.

An act respecting judicial proceedings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter 118.

An act to authorize the taxation of real estate owned by literary institutions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

All real estate belonging to literary institutions in Real estate bethis state, not exempted by the "articles of separation," except their academy and college buildings and the lots on which they are erected, shall be liable to be taxed for all purposes and in the same manner as other real estate is now taxed under existing laws.
