Chapter 198.

CHAP. 198.

An act to set off Bear Island, in the town of Mount Desert, and annex the same to Cranberry Isles.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

From and after the passage of this act, "Bear Island," in the town of Mount Desert, is hereby set off from that town and annexed to the town of Cranberry Isles.

Bear Island annexed to Cranberry Isles.

Chapter 199.

An act to incorporate the Oxford Woolen Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Harrison J. Libby, Francis O. Libby, James B. Libby, Han-
 son M. Hart, Henry B. Hart, William Kimball, Orin Jones, and
 A. M. Jones and their associates and successors, are constituted
 and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the
 Oxford Woolen Manufacturing Company, with all the powers
 and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities pro-
 vided in the laws of this state concerning manufacturing cor-
 porations; and are authorized to purchase and hold real and
 personal estate not exceeding in value, at any one time, the
 sum of twenty thousand dollars; and the same may improve,
 lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal
 estate may lawfully do. And said company are authorized to
 carry on, at Craig's Mills, in the town of Oxford, the manufac-
 ture of cotton and wool and such other materials as may be
 necessarily and conveniently connected therewith, and may
 erect and construct such machinery, mills, and other buildings
 as may be useful for that purpose.
