ought to be chargeable for the year eighteen hundred and forty-eight, in consequence of the incorporation of said town by an act approved June twenty-fourth, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, from a portion of the town of Dresden.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 260.

An act to incorporate the Winthrop and Readfield Bank.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. David Stanley, Alexander Belcher, Ephraim Wood, J. W. Heath, Samuel Clark, Stephen Sewall, Daniel Carr, Albert Sturtevant, Samuel Chandler, Ransom Bishop, Seth May, Cyrus Bishop, E. W. Kelley, L. S. Prince, John Hartwell, N. Currier, E. M. Clark, Joshua Wing, J. R. Bachelder, Anson P. Morrill, Job Prince, Samuel P. Benson, Thomas J. Burgess, Warren Hathaway, Morrill Stanley, their associates, successors and assigns, be and hereby are incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Winthrop and Readfield Bank.

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, and said bank shall be located and established in Winthrop in the county of Kennebec.

Capital stock.

Location.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered, to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities thereof.

Powers, privileges and liabilities.

### Chapter 261.

An act to prevent the destruction of fish in Sabbath-day pond.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking trout from Sabbath-day pond, in the town of New Gloucester

Trout not to be taken from said pond between Sept. 20 and Nov. 20 of each year.

CHAP. 262. and county of Cumberland, at any time between the twentieth day of September and the twentieth day of November, in each year.

Liability of persons offending.

SECT. 2. If any person shall take any trout contrary to the provisions of the first section of this act, upon conviction thereof before any court competent to try the same, he shall forfeit and pay a fine not exceeding five dollars, one half thereof to the complainant and the other half to the use of the town where the said pond lies.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 262.

An act to authorize the laying out a road over tide waters in the towns of Georgetown and Arrowsic in the county of Lincoln.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Authorized to lay out a road over waters not navigable by vessels over five tons.

The county commissioners of the county of Lincoln are hereby authorized and empowered, if they deem it for the public convenience and expedient so to do, to lay out and establish a public highway, in the said towns of Georgetown and Arrowsic, in said county, over tide waters, which are not navigated by vessels of over five tons burthen and not so as to obstruct the use of said waters for boats, gondolas, or rafts where the said waters are now used for such purposes.

Not to obstruct the use of said waters for boats, &c.

### Chapter 263.

An act to increase the capital stock of the Buckfield Branch Railroad Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Increase, \$150,000.

The Buckfield Branch Railroad Company are hereby authorized to increase the capital stock of said company one hundred and fifty thousand dollars in addition to its present capital, to be divided into shares in the manner provided by law.
