shall have power to determine and fill any vacancy or vacancies that may occur in the said board by death, removal, resignation, disability or otherwise, so as to keep up the number of not more than nine nor less than seven, forever; seven of whom shall be members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and in case of death, resignation, or disability of either of the aforesaid officers, the said corporation shall have a right in like manner at any meeting regularly called for that purpose, to fill any vacancy that may so happen.

Annual income, how applied. Sect. 3. All the estate of said corporation, both real and personal, shall be used and improved to the best advantage, and the annual income thereof, together with the annual subscriptions and donations and contributions, which shall be made to said corporation, besides contributions to its permanent funds, shall be applied to the sole use and purpose of education, within the bounds of the Maine Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, in accordance with the direction of said conference or of the donors.

First meeting.

SECT. 4. George Webber, David H. Goodeno and Stephen Allen, be and hereby are authorized to fix the time and place of the first meeting, and to give notice thereof by mail, to each of their associates, at least fifteen days before the time of meeting.

#### Chapter 275.

An act to authorize the proprietors of Lewiston Bridge to reduce their tolls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Foot passengers, one cent each. The proprietors of Lewiston Bridge be and they are hereby authorized, instead of the tolls granted for foot passengers, in the third section of the act incorporating said proprietors, to take and receive one cent for each and every foot passenger crossing their bridge.
