CHAP. 125.

[Approved June 5, 1849.]

Chapter 125.

Resolve in relation to binding the public laws of this state.

Resolved, That the secretary of state cause one hundred volumes of the public acts passed since eighteen hundred and forty-one, to be substantially bound, and properly lettered for the use of the legislative and executive department of the government, and that he cause a title page, table of contents, and general index to be prepared for each volume.

Chapter 126.

Resolve relating to the valuation of the towns of Harrington and Milbridge.

Resolved, That the number of polls set to the valuation of the town of Harrington in the county of Washington be one hundred thirty-four, and the value of estates be fifty-six thousand, seven hundred and one dollars, instead of the number and sum now fixed by law; and that the valuation of the town of Milbridge, in said county, be one hundred seventy-two polls and fifty-eight thousand, eight hundred and seven dollars on estates, and that all taxes hereafter shall be assessed accordingly.

Chapter 127.

Resolve in favor of Benjamin Chadbourne.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Benjamin Chadbourne of Bradford, the additional sum of two dollars per month for the term of five years from the

Chapter 128.

Resolve in favor of the widow and children of John G. Deane.

Land agent authorized to convey certain lands.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to make and execute to Rebecca D. Deane, Melvin G. Deane, Joseph P. Deane, Henry P. Deane, Frederick A. Deane, Llewellyn H. Deane and William W. Deane, the widow and children of John G. Deane, late of the city of Portland, deceased, a deed of lot numbered sixty-six, situate in the north half of township number three, in the sixth range of townships, west from the east line of the state, the conveyance of said lot to be in lieu of the grant of lot number sixty-five in said township, by resolve in favor of the widow and children of John G. Deane, approved August eighth, eighteen hundred and forty eight, which said lot number sixty-five had been previously alienated by the state; and so much of said resolve of August eighth one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, as authorizes the conveyance of said lot number sixty-five, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Chapter 129.

Resolve relating to the valuation of the towns of Mount Desert and Tremont.

Valuation of Mt. Desert.

Resolved, That the number of polls set to the valuation of the town of Mount Desert in the county of Hancock, be one hundred and forty-eight; and the value of estates sixty-eight thousand two hundred and three dollars, instead of the sum now fixed by law; and that the valuation of the town of Tremont be one hundred and eighty polls, and sixty-six thousand and seventy-one dollars on estates, and that all taxes hereafter shall be assessed accordingly.
