Chapter 135.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the state.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of state out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, towns and plantations mentioned in the roll of accounts numbered thirty, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of seven thousand eight hundred and fourteen dollars and sixty-six cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 136.

Resolve making valid the doings of the First Universalist Society in Augusta.

Whereas, clerks and assessors of the First Universalist Society in Augusta, elected at various times since the organization of said society, have not been sworn, as required by law, and the meetings of said society have not at all times been called and held in accordance with the provisions of law :

Resolved, That the doings and acts of said First Universalist Society in Augusta, and of their officers aforesaid, shall in no wise be invalidated or rendered illegal or void in consequence of the omissions and irregularities above stated ; but said acts and doings shall be of the same force and effect as though said provisions of law had been complied with.
