Chapter 201.

Resolve making a grant of land in aid of a road from the American line on the river Saint John to the Allegash river.

Resolved, That there is hereby granted the proceeds of the Appropriation. sale of a half township of land to be selected by the governor and council and sold under their direction, for the erection of bridges across the streams and rivers in the line of a road from the American line on the river Saint John to the Allegash river, which shall be expended under the direction of the governor and council: provided, the county commissioners for the county Proviso. of Aroostook shall proceed to make such further location of a road, and alterations in the present road, as will best promote the interest of the state and accommodate the settlers on the Saint John river; and provided further, that the governor and council shall not expend more than three thousand dollars in aid of said road.

Chapter 202.

Resolve relative to M. Vattemare's system of International Exchange.

Resolved, That duplicate copies of various works in the state library (not otherwise required,) be tendered to M. Vattemare in continuation of the system of international exchange so auspiciously commenced, the selection to be made under the supervision of the secretary of state.
