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CHAP. 206.**Chapter 206.**

Resolve for the pay roll of the house of representatives.

Pay roll of house.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury of this state, to the several persons named in the foregoing pay roll, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole to thirty-three thousand five hundred and sixty-seven dollars.

**Chapter 207.**

Resolve in favor of Simeon Robbins.

Expenses of sickness.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury to the several persons named below, being on account of expenses incurred by Simeon Robbins during his sickness while in attendance as a member of the house of representatives at the present session of the legislature, namely :

To Daniel Lincoln, forty-two dollars ;  
 Susan E. Dulon, fifty-five dollars ;  
 Wills & Lombard, five dollars thirty cents ;  
 Palmer Branch, seventy dollars ;  
 Sarah Dulon, six dollars fifty cents ;  
 Hiram Reed, two dollars ;  
 George W. Duncan, three dollars ;  
 A. D. Brown, one dollar fifty cents ;  
 Doctor H. H. Hill, thirty one dollars ;  
 Doctor C. Briggs, seven dollars fifty cents ;

Said several sums amounting, in the aggregate to the sum of two hundred and twenty-eight dollars and eighty cents.

**Chapter 208.**

Resolve for the payment of certain accounts against the state.

Accounts against the state.

*Resolved,* That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of forty-eight dollars and seventy-six cents, for the payment of the following accounts, in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer, namely: to Thomas Norton,

coroner, twenty-four dollars and seventy-six cents; to Nathaniel C. Hobbs, adjutant, ten dollars; to William R. Snow, for advertising notices, six dollars; to the town of Brownville, for bounty on animals, eight dollars.

### Chapter 209.

Resolve in favor of William P. Merriam and George C. Harriman.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury of state, not otherwise appropriated, eleven dollars, to William P. Merriam, and five dollars and sixty cents to George C. Harriman, for mileage.

In favor of Wm. P. Merriam and G. C. Harriman.

### Chapter 210.

Resolve in favor of the secretary of the senate, and the clerk of the house of representatives.

*Resolved*, That there be paid out of any money in the treasury of state, not otherwise appropriated, to Daniel T. Pike, fifty dollars for making indexes to the journal of the senate, and to Edmund W. Flagg, fifty dollars for making index to the journal of the house of representatives.

In favor of the secretary of the senate and clerk of the house.

### Chapter 211.

Resolve in favor of the towns of Hartland and Canaan.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state is hereby authorized and directed to deduct forty-four polls, and the sum of sixteen thousand nine hundred and twelve dollars from the valuation of Hartland, and annex the same to the valuation of Canaan.
