Chapter 213.

Resolve in favor of certain persons.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of state, out of any moneys not otherwise appropriated, to Benjamin B. Thomas forty-nine dollars and fifty cents, for his services as assistant messenger; to George C. Harriman twenty-four dollars and seventy-five cents, for his services as second assistant messenger; to William P. Merriam, nineteen dollars and eighty cents for his services as page.
