Chapter 185.

An act giving further power to courts of probate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

May cause property in the hands of executors, &c., to be insured.

The judge of probate may, at his discretion, allow executors or administrators to cause any property of the deceased which may become assets in the hands of such executor or administrator, to be insured, and in the settlement of his final account may allow him the expense thereof, and may also allow any executor or administrator, in the settlement of his account, such reasonable per centage as such judge may deem reasonable and just.

Chapter 186.

An act fixing the salary of the judge of the municipal court in Bath.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Salary.

SECT. 1. The judge of the municipal court of the city of Bath shall receive a yearly salary, such as the city authorities of Bath may establish, instead of the fees now received, which shall be in full of all fees and emoluments pertaining to said office, to be paid quarterly out of the city treasury; and he shall account for and pay over, to the treasurer of said city, all fees received by him in said capacity. The said city shall provide a room for holding said court, and shall also pay all other necessary expenses of said court.

Fees to be accounted for.

City to defray expenses of holding court.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval.
