Certain acts made valid.

Снар. 352.

#### Chapter 352.

An act to make valid the proceedings of the town of Sebasticook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The proceedings of the town of Sebasticook and its officers in laying out a road and building a bridge across the Sebasticook river in said town, and in voting to raise money for said purpose and all acts of said officers in assessing money and collecting the same, are hereby made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

#### Chapter 353.

An act to authorize Joseph Smith to extend his wharf in Muscongus cove.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Joseph Smith is hereby authorized to extend the wharf which he now owns in Muscongus cove in the town of Bremen fifty feet further into the harbor, of the same width of his present wharf, and in the same direction as said wharf now runs.

Chapter 354.

An act to set off a part of the town of Hartford and annex the same to the town of Canton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. From and after the passage of this act, all that part of the town of Hartford, in the county of Oxford, which lies north of the following line, to wit: beginning at the southeast corner of lot number nine, and on the town line between the towns of Hartford and Livermore; thence west, to the southwest corner of said lot; thence north, to the northwest corner of said lot; thence west on the lot lines, to Benjamin Dearborn's
