CHAP. 382.

Chapter 382.

An act authorizing the trustees of Union Academy to dispose of their property.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authority to sell
property.

The trustees of Union Academy in Kennebunk are hereby authorized to sell the real estate and other property belonging to said corporation and after paying the debts of the corporation to make a pro rata distribution of the proceeds of such sale to the original subscribers to its funds.

Chapter 383.

An act to incorporate the trustees of Lebanon Academy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Nathaniel Lord, Thomas M. Wentworth, James Stanton, Isaac Copp, James K. Lord, William Wentworth, Timothy L. Kimball, Tilley H. Ricker, Samuel W. Jones, Charles Shapleigh, David B. Cowell, Daniel W. Horn, Elihu Hayes, junior, Frederick Dixon, Levi Cowell, Ivory Fall, junior, Moses W. Shapleigh, Eli B. Lord, James B. Stanton, and Reuben H. Copp, their associates and successors are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the trustees of Lebanon Academy ; and by that name shall have power to prosecute and defend suits at law ; to have and use a common seal and change the same at pleasure ; to hold for the objects of their association the property now in their possession ; and, for the same objects, to take and hold, by gift, grant, devise, bequest or otherwise, any estate real or personal the annual income of which shall not exceed two thousand dollars.

SECT. 2. All property now in the possession of said board of trustees in their incorporate capacity, together with all estate real and personal which they may hereafter receive by donation or otherwise, shall be faithfully applied to the promotion of the cause of education in maintaining an academy in the town of Lebanon in the county of York ; and the trustees aforesaid may make such by-laws, not repugnant to the constitution and laws of this state, as they may deem expedient for the manage-
