CHAP. 223.**Chapter 223.**

Resolve in favor of certain members of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Appropriation for
the purchase of
seeds, provisions,
agricultural im-
plements, &c.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated out of the treasury of this state the sum of two hundred dollars to be expended under the direction of the agent of the Passamaquoddy Indians in the purchase of seed, provisions, agricultural implements and stoves, in such proportions as he may deem expedient, for the benefit of those members of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians residing on the Indian township in the county of Washington, who are engaged in farming operations on said township; and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer of state for said sum and pay the same to said Indian agent who shall be required to account for the same in the same manner as for all other sums of money which he receives in his said capacity. And this resolve shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 224.

Resolve abating a state tax on the town of Hartland.

Directed to abate
\$52.18 of the
state tax.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be and hereby is directed to abate fifty-one dollars and eighteen cents of the state tax assessed upon the town of Hartland for the year eighteen hundred and fifty, and add the same amount to the state tax for the same year to the town of Canaan.

Chapter 225.

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties of the state for the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty.

County taxes.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties contained in the following schedule are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed, collected and

applied, for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same and other purposes ordered by law, to wit :

York, twelve thousand five hundred dollars ;	York.
Lincoln, twenty-one thousand dollars ;	Lincoln.
Hancock, seven thousand dollars ;	Hancock.
Washington, six thousand five hundred dollars ;	Washington.
Kennebec, eighteen thousand six hundred and sixteen dollars ;	Kennebec.
Somerset, six thousand nine hundred dollars ;	Somerset.
Piscataquis, three thousand five hundred dollars ;	Piscataquis.
Franklin, three thousand nine hundred dollars ;	Franklin.
Aroostook, two thousand two hundred dollars.	Aroostook.

Chapter 226.

Resolve laying a tax on the county of Oxford in said state for the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty.

Resolved, That the sum annexed to the county hereinafter named, is hereby granted as a tax to be appropriated, assessed, collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, to wit :

Oxford, eight thousand dollars.

Chapter 227.

Resolve making an appropriation for repairing a bridge across the mouth of the Mattawamkeag river.

Resolved, That the sum of twelve hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated, to be expended under the direction of the present land agent for the purpose of repairing the bridge across the mouth of the Mattawamkeag river on the Military road.

\$1,200, to be expended under the direction of the land agent.
