Chapter 230.**CHAP. 230.**

Resolve in favor of the treasurer of the county of Aroostook.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to J. V. Putnam, treasurer of the county of Aroostook, the sum of thirty-eight dollars and ninety-seven cents, it being the sum paid by said treasurer to plantation number eleven, range one, west from the east line of the state, being the amount due to said plantation from the annual school fund up to and including the year eighteen hundred and forty-seven which has never been paid by the state: and so much of the resolves entitled, "resolves relating to portions of the school fund belonging to certain plantations," approved August eighth, eighteen hundred and forty-eight, as provides for the payment of the aforesaid sum to said plantation, be and the same hereby is repealed.

Chapter 231.

Resolve abating the interest on the road tax in number one, range two, Somerset county, west of Kennebec river.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the state be hereby authorized and directed to abate the sum of sixty-seven dollars and eighty-nine cents, it being amount of interest accrued on the road taxes, assessed by the county of Somerset in the years eighteen hundred and forty-six and eighteen hundred forty-seven, on township number one, in the second range, Bingham purchase, west of the Kennebec river; the said taxes having in fact been fully paid to said county in labor by the proprietors, before the date when said interest began to accrue.

Chapter 232.

Resolve laying a tax on the several counties of the state herein named, for the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-one.

Resolved, That the sums annexed to the counties contained in the following schedule, are hereby granted as a tax for each county respectively, to be appropriated, assessed,

CHAP. 233.

collected and applied for the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of the same, and other purposes ordered by law, to wit:

Cumberland.	Cumberland, sixteen thousand dollars;
Penobscot.	Penobscot, sixteen thousand dollars;
Waldo.	Waldo, nine thousand, three hundred and fifty dollars;
Hancock.	Hancock, seven thousand dollars;
Franklin.	Franklin, three thousand nine hundred dollars.

Chapter 233.

Resolve in favor of Attean Lola.

Representatives
of the Penobscot
tribe of Indians—
traveling expen-
ses—\$50.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Attean Lola the sum of fifty dollars, it being to remunerate him for expenses incurred in traveling to and from the seat of government, as representative of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty.

Chapter 234.

Resolve in favor of Joe Sockbasin.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Joe Sockbasin fifteen dollars, for expenses of traveling and attendance before this legislature, to obtain the benefit of education for the Penobscot tribe of Indians at Oldtown.

Chapter 235.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Porus.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of this state to Joseph Porus fifteen dollars, for expenses of traveling and attendance before this legislature, to obtain the benefit of education for the Penobscot tribe of Indians at Oldtown.
