Chapter 242.

Resolve in favor of the town of Falmouth.

Whereas, the town of Falmouth has lost, by fire, the copy of the revised statutes, allowed them by law, therefore,

In favor of the town of Falmouth. Resolved, That the secretary of state, be and hereby is authorized to supply said town with a copy of the revised statutes.

Chapter 243.

Resolve in favor of Samuel L. Harris.

Authorized to audit the accounts of S. L. Harris.

—to allow such sums as they shall deem just and equitable.

-to draw war-

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to audit the accounts of Samuel L. Harris for services rendered the state in prosecuting her claims against the general government under the fifth article of the treaty of Washington, and to allow him such sums as they shall deem just and equitable in full compensation for his services rendered prior to July first, eighteen hundred fifty, and to draw warrants on the treasury therefor.
