CHAP. 242.**Chapter 242.**

Resolve in favor of the town of Falmouth.

Whereas, the town of Falmouth has lost, by fire, the copy of the revised statutes, allowed them by law, therefore,

Resolved, That the secretary of state, be and hereby is authorized to supply said town with a copy of the revised statutes.

Chapter 243.

Resolve in favor of Samuel L. Harris.

Authorized to audit the accounts of S. L. Harris.

Resolved, That the governor and council are hereby authorized to audit the accounts of Samuel L. Harris for services rendered the state in prosecuting her claims against the general government under the fifth article of the treaty of Washington, and to allow him such sums as they shall deem just and equitable in full compensation for his services rendered prior to July first, eighteen hundred fifty, and to draw warrants on the treasury therefor.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state out of any money not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, towns and plantations mentioned in the roll of accounts numbered thirty-one, the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of five thousand nine hundred forty-four dollars and fifty-four cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

Resolve in favor of Thomas S. Roberts.

Resolved, That the land agent for this state be and hereby is authorized to convey to Thomas S. Roberts one hundred and sixty acres of land to be selected by himself in township number three, eighth range, west half, in the county of Penobscot and north of the Waldo patent, so called.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to expend the sum of four hundred dollars, for the repair of the military road in township number two, range three, west from the east line of the state; and said agent is directed to make application to the state of Massachusetts to refund said money, the fee of said township being in said state of Massachusetts.
