Chapter 269.

Resolve in favor of Hiram Lyford.

In favor of Hiram Lyford. Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey by deed to Hiram Lyford or his heirs, two hundred acres of settling land to be selected from either of the following townships, to wit: township numbered two, Indian purchase, in the county of Penobscot, and letter D, in the second range of townships west of the east line of the state in the county of Washington: provided the said Lyford or his heirs shall within five years from the passage of this resolve, perform all the settling duties on the same, required by the laws of this state.

Chapter 270.

Resolve for the promotion of education of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

In favor of education of Penobscot Indians. Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars is hereby appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of this state to the superintending school committee of the town of Oldtown in the county of Penobscot, and expended under the direction of said committee as follows: twenty-five dollars for the purchase of suitable books and the remainder for the purposes of educating the youth of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.
