Chapter 269.

Resolve in favor of Hiram Lyford.

In favor of Hiram
Lyford.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized to convey by deed to Hiram Lyford or his heirs, two hundred acres of settling land to be selected from either of the following townships, to wit: township numbered two, Indian purchase, in the county of Penobscot, and letter D, in the second range of townships west of the east line of the state in the county of Washington: *provided* the said Lyford or his heirs shall within five years from the passage of this resolve, perform all the settling duties on the same, required by the laws of this state.

Chapter 270.

Resolve for the promotion of education of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

In favor of edu-
cation of Penob-
scot Indians.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars is hereby appropriated to be paid out of the treasury of this state to the superintending school committee of the town of Oldtown in the county of Penobscot, and expended under the direction of said committee as follows: twenty-five dollars for the purchase of suitable books and the remainder for the purposes of educating the youth of the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Chapter 271.

Resolve for obtaining lithographic views of interesting localities within the state.

In favor of lith-
ographic draw-
ing.

Resolved, That the governor and council, be and they hereby are authorized to employ some person of adequate artistic skill to take original drawings of such of the many interesting views and natural sceneries within the state, as they may select, also some suitable artist to lithograph and print ——— hundred copies of such drawings, each print to be accompanied with a short sketch, descriptive, historical or traditional, such as shall impart to the work its appropriate interest. The prints are to be put into suitable binding, and be at the disposal of the legis-

lature : *provided however*, the whole thing can be accomplished in a creditable style and at a cost not exceeding five hundred dollars.

CHAP. 272.

Chapter 272.

Resolve in favor of Daniel B. Hinckley.

Resolved, That there be appropriated out of the treasury of this state to Daniel B. Hinckley thirteen hundred and twenty-six dollars in full for the claim of Isaac Lewis for improvements in township numbered five in the eleventh range of townships, west of the east line of the state : *provided also* that said Hinckley transfer and make over without recourse to the treasurer of state, one half portion of the notes of Leavitt and others, to A. and I. Lewis and now held by said Hinckley and described in a mortgage conveying improvements in township numbered five in the eleventh range so that the state may enforce payment thereof.

Chapter 273.

Resolves in favor of a survey for the European and North American Railway.

Resolved, That the governor be authorized to cause a reconnoissance and preliminary survey to be made of a route for said railway, from the city of Bangor crossing the Penobscot river north of the Bangor and Brewer bridge, over the most practicable and direct route in a line to the city of St. John in New Brunswick, to the eastern boundary of the state ; so as to connect therewith a railway to be constructed from said city of St. John to said eastern boundary.

Authorizing the survey of the European and N. American Railway.
Line of road.

Resolved, That the governor be authorized to draw his warrants upon the treasury from time to time not exceeding the sum of five thousand dollars, to defray the necessary expenses of said reconnoissance and survey : said sum to be expended and paid under the direction of the governor and council.

Expenses, how paid.

Resolved, That the persons conducting said survey, shall examine and report such geological and minerological evidence and facts as shall be discovered by them in making such survey.

Duty of agent, &c.
