Chapter 291.

CHAP. 291.

Resolve in favor of Daniel B. Hinckley.

Resolved, That instead of the transfer of the notes of Leavitt and others mentioned in the resolve approved August twentieth, eighteen hundred and fifty, entitled “ resolve in favor of Daniel B. Hinckley,” said Hinckley shall procure from A. and I. Lewis and Dudley F. Leavitt a quitclaim deed, conveying to the said state all the improvements on, and all their right, title and interest in township number five, in the eleventh range west from the east line of the state aforesaid.

Resolve for the payment of additional roll of accounts number thirty-one.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury of state, not otherwise appropriated, to the several persons, cities, towns and plantations, respectively named in the additional roll of accounts numbered thirty-one, the sums set against the names of such persons, cities, towns

and plantations, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of nine thousand two hundred and forty dollars and twenty cents in full discharge of the claims and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 293.

Resolve in favor of Patricktown plantation.

Resolved, That the county commissioners of the county of Lincoln be and hereby are authorized to expend the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars out of the treasury of said county to aid the plantation of Patricktown in making and completing a county road, laid out in the year eighteen hundred and forty-six, through the south part of said plantation, by the county commissioners of said county of Lincoln.

And the money thus appropriated shall be expended on said road, under the superintendence of said commissioners, or by their agent appointed for that purpose, within one year from the passage of this resolve.

Chapter 294.

Resolve in favor of William D. Hoar.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state to William D. Hoar, late treasurer of the town of Monson, the sum of four dollars and twenty-five cents, it being the amount of costs paid by said Hoar on a warrant issued against him by the state treasurer.

Resolved, That the adjutant general is hereby authorized to repair, or sell at public or private sale, and transfer by deed,
