CHAP. 299. Academy one half township of land owned in severalty by this state, said land to be selected by said trustees, and to be equal in value as near as may be to that granted to the Lee Normal School, for the purpose of establishing a department of education in connection with said academy, for practical instruction in chemical analysis, and its application to agriculture and the mechanic arts.

Chapter 299.

Resolve in favor of the town of Chester.

Town of Chester. *Resolved*, That the secretary of state be authorized and directed to deliver to the town of Chester one copy of Maine Reports, Acts and Resolves of the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty-eight, and Eastman's Digest, the same being lost by fire, providing the same can be spared from the library.

Chapter 300.

Resolve to authorize the sale of real estate in the town of Brewer belonging to the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Lands in Brewer, sale of. *Resolved*, That the Indian agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, is hereby authorized to sell real estate, purchased for said tribe, in the town of Brewer, the proceeds of the sale to be used the same as any other money belonging to the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Chapter 301.

Resolve in regard to the European and North American Railway Company.

European and North American Railway. *Resolved*, That the governor is hereby authorized and empowered to communicate to the president and congress of the United States from time to time such information as he may

deem it advisable to lay before them, as to the advantages of the route through Maine proposed for the European and North American Railway for securing the most rapid means of communication between Europe and America, and to invite such co-operation on the part of the general government in aid of the same as the interests of Maine may require.

Chapter 302.

Resolve in favor of Sarah T. Webber.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state is hereby authorized and directed, to pay out of the treasury of the state, to Sarah T. Webber or her order, such sum as the committee on the pay roll, may allow and make up, for service and travel of Thomas M. Webber, late member of this house.
