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## Chapter 331.

## CHAP. 331.

Resolve making an appropriation for the repair of the road from the east line of the state on township Letter D, near the Aroostook falls, to township number eleven in the fifth range west of the east line of the state.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he hereby is authorized to expend the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars upon the road lying between the east line of the state on township Letter D, near the Aroostook falls, to township number eleven in the fifth range west of the east line of the state.

## Chapter 332.

Resolve in favor of Alpheus A. Hanscom.

*Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to Alpheus A. Hanscom, eight dollars for advertising in the Maine Democrat in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight and nine.

## Chapter 333.

Resolve in favor of the clerks employed assessing a state tax.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state be authorized to pay the sum of ten dollars and fifty cents to the clerks employed for the purpose of assessing a state tax by the committee on finance.

Resolve in favor of re-organizing the judicial courts.

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### Chapter 335.

Resolve for payment of expenses incurred in the funeral of Daniel Ring, deceased.

Funeral expenses

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury of this state the several sums named in this resolve, for expenses incurred and paid on account of the death and funeral of Daniel Ring, a member of this house from the town of Cambridge, viz: to Daniel Lincoln, twenty-seven dollars; to B. F. Greene, fifteen dollars; to Gilman Turner, thirty dollars; to Joseph Drew, five dollars and one cent; to Seward Ham, two dollars, seventy-one cents; to Thomas Fuller, three dollars, fifty cents; and to Moses F. Davis, fifty-seven cents; making in all, eighty-three dollars, seventy-nine cents.

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### Chapter 336.

Resolve in favor of the town of Brewer.

*Resolved,* That there be paid out of the treasury of the state to the treasurer of Brewer, out of any money not otherwise appropriated, the sum of thirty-five dollars and seventy-five cents, it being for expenses paid to the insane hospital for state paupers.
