having been heretofore sold, and Letter D, in the second range of townships west of the east line of the state in the county of Washington, *provided* the said Hiram Lyford or his heirs shall within five years from the passage of this resolve perform all the settling duties on said land required by the laws of this state.

CHAP. 339.

Chapter 339.

Resolve setting apart the proceeds of the public lands as a fund for the payment of the public debt.

Resolved, That all the lands owned by the state of Maine, either in severalty or in common with the commonwealth of Massachusetts, (other than those located or may hereafter be located for settlement) not heretofore otherwise appropriated, are hereby set apart for the creation of a fund to pay the public debt of this state ; and the proceeds of the sale thereof except so much as may be required for the expense of surveying and controlling them, and the location, construction and maintenance of roads on said lands, shall be hereafter paid into the treasury and applied to that purpose alone, until said debt shall be extinguished ; and whenever there shall be funds in the treasury arising from this source not wanted for the payment of the public debt maturing within the year, the treasurer is hereby authorized to anticipate the payment of any of the public debt maturing during the next succeeding year: *provided*, that nothing in this resolve shall be so construed as to authorize the sale of more land, than is now allowed by law.

Chapter 340.

Resolve for building a bridge across Moose river.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated from the treasury of the state, for building a bridge across Moose river, in Somerset county, to be expended under the direction of the land agent: *provided* the

CHAP. 341. inhabitants interested in said bridge shall contribute such further sum as may be necessary to complete the construction of said bridge.

Chapter 341.

Resolve in favor of the Baring and Houlton road.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to expend one hundred and fifty dollars in repairing the Baring and Houlton road, one hundred thereof to be expended in township number eleven, at the monument, and the balance in Orient.
