Chapter 435.

An act giving certain powers to the first parish in Freeport.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to
sell land.

Proceeds of sale,
how applied.

The inhabitants of the first parish in Freeport in the county of Cumberland are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey the land or common where the old meeting house formerly stood, the same being a part of the parsonage and ministerial land belonging to said first parish, and to apply the proceeds of the said sale to the ministerial fund thereof, to be appropriated as the other funds in said ministerial fund are now by law appropriated.

Chapter 436.

An act to extend the time for filing the location and the time for completing the railroad of the Great Falls and South Berwick Branch Railroad Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Extension of
time to file loca-
tion, &c.

Time extended
to complete said
railroad.

SECT. 1. The time for filing with the county commissioners of the county of York, the location of the route for the railroad of the Great Falls and South Berwick Branch Railroad Company is hereby extended to the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two ; and the time for completing said railroad is hereby extended to the first day of January in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty-four, and the location and completion of said railroad within the periods above limited shall have the same force and effect as if the same had been done within the periods limited in the charter of said corporation, or in the amendments and additions thereto.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from the time of its passage.
