PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1851.

SECT. 3. The powers granted by this act, may be enlarged, restricted or annulled at the pleasure of the legislature.

SECT. 4. Peleg Wordsworth is hereby empowered to call the first meeting of said corporation by giving such previous notice as he may think proper, at which meeting any corporation business may be transacted.

Chapter 450.

An act to incorporate the Liberty Manufacturing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

William K. Hunt, William H. Hunt, Augustus Hunt, Henry Erskins, J. M. Murry, E. G. Brown, Samuel Atkinson, J. C. Knowlton, David Knowlton, J. B. Clough, William Sanborn and their associates and successors, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Liberty Manufacturing Company, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the duties and liabilities, provided in the laws of this state, concerning manufacturing corporations; and said corporation is authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate, not exceeding in value at any one time, fifty thousand dollars, and the same may improve, lease, sell and convey, as other proprietors of real and personal estate may lawfully do. And said company are authorized to carry on, at Liberty, in the county of Waldo, the manufacture of cotton and wool, and such other materials as may be necessarily connected therewith, and may erect and construct such machinery, mills and other buildings as may be useful for that purpose.

Chapter 451.

An act to amend an act creating the Norway Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

That an act creating the Norway Village Corporation, passed August twenty-eighth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, be amended in the fourth line of the

second section by the insertion of the word "purchase" after the word "the" and before the word "repair," so that the whole section as amended shall read as follows, viz. Said corporation is hereby invested with power at any legal meeting called for the purpose to raise such sums of money as may be sufficient for the purchase, repair and preservation of one or more fire engines, engine houses, hose, buckets, ladders or other apparatus for the extinguishment of fire, for the construction of reservoirs and aqueducts for the procuring of water, and for organizing and maintaining within the limits of said territory an efficient fire department.

Chapter 452.

An act to change the name of the Maine Mammouth Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporate name
changed.

SECT. 1. That the corporate name of the Maine Mammouth Mutual Fire Insurance Company be and it is hereby changed unto that of the Augusta Mutual Fire Insurance Company, by which latter name the said corporation shall hereafter be styled and known; and the said Augusta Mutual Fire Insurance Company shall retain all the rights, and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and obligations now belonging to the Maine Mammouth Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force in sixty days from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 453.

An act to extend the time in which to file the location of the Penobscot and Kennebec Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Filing of location
extended.

The time in which the location of the line of the Penobscot and Kennebec Railroad Company may be filed, is hereby extended to one year from the last day of December next.
