Chapter 454.CHAP. 454.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 2. This act shall be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved June 3, 1851.]

Chapter 455.

An act for the repairing and improving the hospital for the insane.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. There shall be appropriated and paid out of the state treasury for the repair and improvement of the insane hospital the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars to be expended under the direction of John W. Dana, Hugh J. Anderson and Henry Carter with a view to its ultimate completion as originally designed, with such alterations and improvements as the safety and comfort of its inmates may require.

Appropriation for repairs, \$25,000.

How to be expended.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its approval by the governor.

[Approved June 3, 1851.]
