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TOWN OF DAMARISCOTTA.

Chapter 456.

An act to make valid certain doings of the selectmen and town of Damariscotta.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The action of the selectmen of the town of Damariscotta on the fifteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty, in the laying out a road in said town, commencing near John Rafter's corner and ending near Cranberry Meadow bridge, with the subsequent doings of the town in relation thereto, and in accepting the same, are hereby made legal and valid in all respects whatsoever.

SECT. 2. Any person over whose land the laying out of said road passes, and aggrieved at the award of damages made by the selectmen of said town, shall not be deprived by the passage of this act from his right of application to the county commissioners for an increase, as is now provided by law in such cases.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
