Chapter 356.

Resolve on the pay roll of the senate.

Resolved, That there be paid to the several persons named in the accompanying roll the sums set against their names respectively, amounting in the whole, to the sum of two thousand and ninety-seven dollars.

Chapter 357.

Resolve in favor of the secretary of the board of education.

Resolved, That there be paid to the secretary of the board of education out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three hundred dollars, for clerk hire and traveling expenses, any thing in section twelve, article nine, of the law of eighteen hundred and fifty relating to the education of youth, to the contrary notwithstanding.
