CHAP. 373.

Chapter 373.

Resolve making an appropriation for building a bridge over the St. Croix river.

Resolved, That the sum of eight hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, is hereby appropriated, for the building of a bridge over the St. Croix river, in the town of Marsardis, county of Aroostook; providing the inhabitants of said town will aid in building the same, to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 374.

Resolve for the payment of accounts against the state.

Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury of the state out of any money not otherwise appropriated to the several persons, towns and plantations, mentioned in the roll of accounts numbered thirty-two, the sum set against their names respectively, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of eight thousand five hundred and twelve dollars and fifty-five cents, in full discharge of the accounts and demands to which they severally refer.

Chapter 375.

Resolve for an appropriation to be expended on the state road from the Aroostook river at township number eleven to Fort Kent.

Resolved, That there be appropriated out of any money in the treasury, the sum of fifteen hundred dollars, to be expended under the direction of the land agent, upon the state road, from the Aroostook river at township number eleven, range fifth, to Fort Kent.
