Chapter 229.

CHAP. 229.

An act making valid the records of the register of deeds, in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. John D. Richards of Ellsworth, in the county of Hancock, late a clerk in the office of the register of deeds in said county, is hereby authorized and empowered to certify such of the records of Francis B. Morgan, deceased, late register of deeds for the county aforesaid, as were recorded and not certified by said Morgan, and the records so certified shall have the same force and effect as though they had been certified by said Morgan.

Authorized to certify certain records.

Records made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 230.

An act to make valid certain writs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. All writs bearing the test of Joseph G. Cole, late judge of the district court for the western district, and all writs bearing the test of any other of the justices of said district court for any other district returnable in any county in said western district, issued subsequent to the death of said Cole and before the appointment and qualification of the successor of said Cole, are hereby made valid in law.

Certain writs to be valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
