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PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

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CHAP. 471. bank shall be located and established in Winthrop, in the county of Kennebec.

Location in Winthrop.  
Rights and restrictions.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and subject to all the restrictions and liabilities thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 471.

An act to change the name of Calais Village Baptist Society.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Name changed.

The corporate name of Calais Village Baptist Society, in the county of Washington, shall hereafter be Second Baptist Society of Calais ; and this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 472.

An act to set off certain territory from the town of Readfield, and annex the same to the town of Kennebec.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Territory set off from Readfield to Kennebec.

SECT. 1. All that part of the town of Readfield bounded and described as follows, to wit: commencing at the northwest corner of land owned by Carpenter Winslow in Kennebec, and running south sixty-seven and one-half degrees east, to the southwest corner of land of Benjamin Hill ; thence north twenty-two and one-half degrees east to said Hill's northwest corner ; thence north sixty-seven and one-half degrees east to land of Rufus G. Hall ; thence north twenty-two and one-half degrees east to Fifield road ; thence on Fifield road east, twenty-three rods, to the east line of Belgrade road ; thence north on Belgrade road to the northwest corner of the town of Kennebec ; thence westerly on the dividing line between Bel-
