CHAP. 537.

Chapter 537.

An act authorizing the selectmen of Wiscasset, or county commissioners of the county of Lincoln, to lay out a road over tide waters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Road authorized.

Location of.

Proviso.

Road, how located.

Acceptance, &c., to be recorded.

SECT. 1. The selectmen of the town of Wiscasset in the county of Lincoln are hereby authorized and empowered to lay out and establish a town-way or road over tide waters in said town, from the foot or southerly end of Pleasant street to an island formerly called Holbrook's island, now occupied by the "Clark Steam Mill Company," over and upon the present bridge, between the termini above named, and said town is hereby authorized and empowered to approve and allow said way or road, and put the same on record, *provided* the proprietors of said bridge relinquish to said town without compensation, their interest in said bridge.

SECT. 2. If the selectmen of said town after being duly requested, shall unreasonably refuse or neglect to lay out and establish said town-way or road, the county commissioners of said county of Lincoln are hereby authorized and empowered on due request made to them, to lay out and establish said town-way.

SECT. 3. If after the said town-way shall have been laid out and established by said selectmen, said town shall unreasonably refuse or delay to approve and allow such town-way or road as laid out by said selectmen, and put the same on record, the county commissioners for said county of Lincoln are hereby authorized and empowered on proper application to them, to approve and allow the way as laid out and established by said selectmen, and direct said laying out and acceptance to be recorded by the clerk of said town with the same effect as if accepted by said town and recorded.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
