Chapter 538.

An act to set off a portion of the farm of Stephen D. Burgess from Smithfield, and annex the same to Norridgewock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. All that part of the farm of Stephen D. Burgess of Norridgewock, which is situate in Smithfield, and bounded as follows: beginning at the angle in the town line on the east side of Francis Allen's land; thence running southerly by said Allen's line thirty-three rods and one third to the southwest corner of said Burgess' lot; thence east by said Burgess' south line two hundred and forty rods to said Burgess' southeast corner; thence northerly to the town line about thirty-three rods; thence west to the first mentioned bound, containing about fifty acres is hereby set off from the town of Smithfield and annexed to, and is made a part of the town of Norridgewock.

Certain lands set off from Smithfield and annexed to Norridgewock.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 539.

An act to set off certain persons with their estates from the town of Kennebec to the town of Winthrop.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows .

SECT. 1. Samuel Richards, James Brainard and Orrin Brainard, together with the following described territory, namely: beginning at the southeast corner of land of Orrin Brainard; thence northerly, binding on the east line of said Brainard's land and the east line of the farm of James Brainard, to the farm formerly owned by Luke Perkins, in the town of Kennebec, in the county of Kennebec, are hereby set off from said town of Kennebec and annexed to the town of Winthrop.

Certain lands set off from Kennebec and annexed to Winthrop.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.
