CHAP. 543.

iel Witham, George W. Chase, James M. Hager, George H. Thomas, James C. Boynton, C. Houdlett, J. J. Hathorn, Lemuel Brown, Edward E. Houdlett, Daniel W. Perry, Levi Mustard, M. S. Hager and C. B. Foster, their successors and assigns, are incorporated into a company by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Richmond Bank.

Corporate name.

Capital stock.

Stock, when paid.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said bank shall be fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and said bank shall be located and established in the town of Richmond, in the county of Lincoln; and one half of said capital stock shall be paid in and said bank put in operation, on or before the first day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-two, and the other half within six months thereafter.

Powers, &c.

SECT. 3. The said corporators are hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state, and subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 543.

An act to incorporate the Rockland Hotel Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Samuel Pillsbury, Manasseh S. Whiting, W. H. Thorndike, Charles Holmes, Charles W. Snow, C. R. Mallard, A. D. Nichols, William H. Titcomb, Maynard Sumner, O. B. Fales, A. P. Higgins, Larkin Snow, George L. Snow, S. G. Dennis, D. M. Mitchell, A. L. Lovejoy, W. A. Farnsworth, Solon Merrill, T. K. Osgood, Francis Cobb, A. H. Kimball, S. Spear, junior, G. W. Kimball, and their associates, successors and assigns are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Rockland Hotel Company, for the purpose of building, furnishing and maintaining a public house in the town of Rockland, in the county of Lincoln; and said corporation is hereby authorized and empowered to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges conferred upon such corporations by the laws of this state and subject to all the liabilities and restrictions thereof.

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding forty thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same, and to be divided into such number of shares as they may determine.

CHAP. 544.

May hold property of value of \$40,000.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 544.

An act in addition to an act entitled "an act to incorporate the Merchants' Steam Navigation Company of Bangor."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Said company may hold personal estate to the amount of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, instead of one hundred thousand dollars, and that said company may and shall in all respects have and enjoy the like privileges, and be subject to the same liabilities with the increased capital, as they enjoyed and were subjected to, under the original act passed May thirteenth, eighteen hundred fifty-one.

Right to hold property increased to \$160,000.

Chapter 545.

An act to incorporate the York County Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. J. N. Goodwin, H. H. Hobbs, G. C. Wallingford, Thomas Jewett, John Frost, Benjamin F. Parks, T. F. Jewett, Abner Oakes, John Hanscom, Francis Raynes, Bartholomew Wentworth, Thomas W. Ricker, William A. Young, Shipley W. Ricker, Oscar K. Grant, and Mark T. Goodwin; and all other persons who may hereafter become members of said company, in the manner herein prescribed, be, and they are hereby incorporated, and made a body politic, by the name of the York County Mutual Fire Insurance Company, for the purpose of insuring any description of property, real or personal, against
