Chapter 598.

CHAP. 598.

An act to extend the time for completing the works of the Stillwater Canal Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled as follows :

The time for completing the works of the Stillwater Canal Company, provided for in their charter, be and the same is hereby extended for the term of three years.

Chapter 599.

An act to authorize the sale of the Methodist Episcopal meeting house and parsonage in North Bucksport.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The proprietors of the Methodist Episcopal meeting house and lot, and parsonage house and lot situated in North Bucksport, are hereby authorized and empowered to sell at public auction or otherwise, their meeting house and lot, and parsonage house and lot, *provided* a majority of said proprietors, at a meeting duly and legally called for that purpose, shall vote in favor of said sale.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 600.

An act to incorporate the Wiscasset Fire Company, number one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Alexander Johnston, junior, Daniel Stone, Richard Sanders, Charles H. Ames, William P. Lennox, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a corporation by the name of the Wiscasset Fire Company, number one, for the purpose of more effectually adopting and carrying into effect, suitable measures for preventing and extinguishing fires, as well as for more effectual efforts to save life and prop-
