Chapter 605.

An act to set off Joseph Broad, Silas Broad, and Thomas Broad, from Cape Elizabeth to Westbrook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Lands set off from Cape Elizabeth to Westbrook, Sect. 1. So much of the farm of Joseph Broad and Silas Broad as now is situated in the town of Cape Elizabeth, also Thomas Broad with his land, be and hereby are set off from the said town of Cape Elizabeth, and annexed to, and made a part of the town of Westbrook.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 606.

An act to set off a part of Wayne and annex the same to Winthrop.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Lands set off from Wayne to Winthrop, Boundaries, &c. SECT. 1. From and after the passage of this act, all that part of the town of Wayne in the county of Kennebec included in the following boundaries, to wit: beginning at a point where the north line of John Frost's land cuts the east shore of Wilson's pond; thence easterly on John Frost's north line aforesaid to the westerly line of Winthrop; thence southerly on said easterly line of Winthrop to the north line of Monmouth; thence westerly on said north line of Monmouth, to the easterly shore of said Wilson's pond; thence northerly on the said easterly shore of Wilson's pond to the point begun at, is hereby set off from said town of Wayne and annexed to the town of Winthrop in said county.

Taxes, when paid.

Residence changed.

Sect. 2. The inhabitants on the territory aforesaid, shall pay all taxes legally assessed on their polls and estates that remain due and unpaid, to the collector of Wayne, and those persons only now living and having their houses in that part of Wayne hereby annexed to Winthrop and having their lawful settlement in said town of Wayne, shall from and after the passage of this act be deemed to have their lawful settlements in the town of Winthrop.

[Approved April 19, 1852.]
