Chapter 619.

An act to dissolve the bonds of matrimony between Mary C. Underwood and John A. Underwood.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Bonds of matrimony dissolved.

SECT. 1. The bonds of matrimony between Mary C. Underwood of Eastport, and John A. Underwood, are hereby dissolved.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 620.

An act to dissolve the bonds of matrimony between John Carleton, second, of Woolwich, in the county of Lincoln, and his wife Sarah B. Carleton.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Bonds of matrimony dissolved.

SECT. 1. The bonds of matrimony between John Carleton, second, of Woolwich, in the county of Lincoln, and his wife Sarah B. Carleton, are hereby dissolved.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 621.

An act to change the names of certain persons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Names changed. Wilmot Judson Quimby of Turner, shall be allowed to take the name of Wilmot Judson Littlefield; Maranda H. Thomas, shall be allowed to take the name of Maranda H. Brown; George Washington Hobbs of Milo, shall be allowed to take the name of George Washington; Joseph Warren Richards of Camden, shall be allowed to take the name of Joseph Henry Warren; Ruby Henderson, be allowed to take the name of Ruby McKenzie.
