Chapter 634.

An act to set off William Jellison from Dedham to Ellsworth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. So much of the farm of William Jellison as is now situated in the town of Dedham, beginning on the north line of Ellsworth, which runs east and west, at the northeasterly corner of a lot of land, owned by Alfred Austin; thence running north sixty rods to the northwesterly corner of William Jellison's lot; thence east, one hundred ninety-six rods to the northeasterly corner of said Jellison's lot; thence south sixty rods to the said north line of Ellsworth, is hereby set off to the town of Ellsworth.

Land set off

to Ellsworth.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the governor.

Chapter 635.

An act repealing an act entitled "an act in addition to an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of Bangor,'"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. An act entitled "an act in addition to an act entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of Bangor,'" approved March sixteenth in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. No rights which have arisen under this act repealed shall be affected by the repeal.

Certain rights
not affected.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect on after its approval by the governor.
