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much of said logs or lumber, as may be required to pay said toll and expenses. CHAP. 651.

SECT. 5. All the owners of land from which the logs or other lumber are cut, and which said logs or lumber pass through and over said dam or dams, shall have the right to take an interest in the stock of this company, pro rata, their interest in said land, *provided* they elect so to do, before the construction of said works.

Certain land-holders, right to become stockholders, &c.

### Chapter 651.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. In order to provide for certain acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated, to be paid out of any moneys in the treasury, the same to be in lieu of all existing appropriations for the same purpose. And the governor with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-three, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.
